

Equal Opportunity Statement Policy

Wingle-Tye recognises and welcomes all legislation and existing codes of practice produced by the appropriate Commissions for the promotion of equal opportunities for all.

- 2 encouraging all children to join in all activities, i.e. dressing up, shop, home corner, dolls, climbing, bikes and all physical development activities.**
- 3 regularly reviewing our child care practice to remove those practices which discriminate unfairly on the grounds of gender.**
- 4 challenging any language where appropriate regarding pre-conceptions relating to gender and sexism.**

Wingle-Tye welcomes everybody and will help each individual to fulfill their own potential.

Our aim is to show respectful awareness of all the major events and festivals in the lives of the children and families in the Pre-School and in our society as a whole and to welcome the diversity of backgrounds from which they come. If necessary our policies and procedures will be made available in the appropriate language. We display a wide range of positive images and resources to reflect non-stereotypical roles, racial, cultural and religious diversity and disabilities. All children will be made to feel valued by encouraging high self-esteem through appropriate praise.

Multi-cultural items of dress, cookware, foods and ideas would always be appreciated. The use of such items will greatly enhance a child's awareness and break down the social barriers through play.
